Emkayan's Son Leads Boise Raptor Study

One of the major fall migration routes for raptors such as hawks and eagles is along the foothills north of Boise and the son of a Boise-based Emkayan is leading a research and education project that helps determine the number of birds, their condition and where they are going.

Greg Kaltenecker, whose father Chris Kaltenecker works in Central Accounting in Boise, helped establish the program which is known as the Boise Ridge Raptor Migration Project. Greg is working toward a master's degree in biology at Boise State University and manages the raptor study which is a cooperative effort between Boise State, the Bureau of Land Management, the Forest Service, the Idaho Fish and Game Department, National Biological Service, Audubon Society, and Hawk-Watch International.

Greg's research includes capturing, banding and releasing some of the migrating raptors. A site near Boise was determined to be an ideal place to study and view the birds and for public education. In the photo above, Greg is shown releasing a hawk while a vis-

iting group looks on. He is shown below with a newly banded hawk.

The research has found that many of the raptors who migrate past Boise spend their winters as far away as northern Mexico.
